Fremantle artist Bevan Honey has painted Bon's likeness under the 'new' bridge linking Fremantle to Perth. A work that changes depending on the atmospheric conditions and the time of day, Honey's Bon Scott is a phosphorescent green larrikin grinning out from under the bridge's southern pylon. Entitled *Apparition*, the image is best viewed at dusk.

Curator Jasmin Stephens says, "Bevan Honey's work *Apparition* taps into the depth of local affection for Bon. The work's fugitive nature addresses Bon's unresolved place in Fremantle's history and the transient nature of our memories of him, whether we knew him or not."

As Bon Scott's memory continues to be celebrated across the globe, you too can get the chance to come face-to-face with the spirit of Bon. So grab your mates, pack a picnic, raise your glasses and have a yarn with Bon before he disappears forever!
